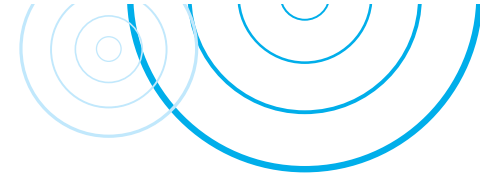

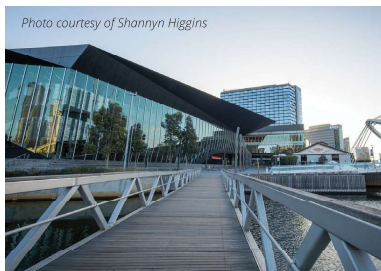

Phillip Island

Mornington Peninsula

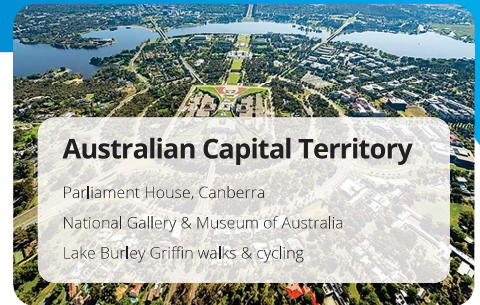
