Our Goods and Service Exports Broke The Republican Era Record in 2025

President Erdoğan said: “With 395.9 billion dollars, our goods and service exports broke the Republican era record in 2025.”



President Erdoğan said: “Our achievements in exports, which we have made with the maxim that we will leave no customs gate where our flag does not wave in global markets, have now become a source of national motivation. With \$395.9 billion, our goods and service exports broke the Republican era record in 2025. And, our service exports, which were 14 billion dollars in 2002, increased to 122.6 billion dollars last year. Our share in the global goods exports

has reached 1.04 per cent from 55 per thousand, and our share in the service exports to 1.28 per cent from 89 per thousand.”

Underscoring that under the shadow of conjectural tensions, Türkiye accomplished 3.6 per cent growth in 2025, and 2.5 per cent in the first quarter of 2026, President Erdoğan noted that they have also carried the growth performance to the last 23 quarters, and said: “Our achievements in exports, which we have made with the maxim that we will leave no customs gate where our flag does not wave in global markets, have now become a source of national motivation.”

Turkish Trade Minister Stresses Importance Of Türkiye-Syria-Gulf Transit Corridor in Light Of War in Region

Corridor through Türkiye, Syria, Jordan and Saudi Arabia has been operating successfully since April 15, says Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat



The Türkiye-Syria-Jordan-Saudi Arabia transit corridor has become critically important for regional trade due to the latest war in the Gulf, Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. ömer Bolat said. “The latest Gulf war also showed that the Türkiye-Syria-Jordan-Saudi Arabia transit corridor is of vital importance, and this corridor has continued to operate successfully since April 15,” Bolat told reporters.

Bolat said Syria had gone through a difficult 14-year period, with major loss of life and widespread destruction across the country. He said a new and stable period had begun in Syria after the “Dec. 8 revolution,” but stressed that building a new state is not easy. Türkiye, particularly under the leadership of President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, has provided strong support to Syria in ensuring its political and territorial integrity and establishing a legitimate administration, Bolat said.

"Things are going well in Syria. As Türkiye, after the Dec. 8 revolution, we have been in constant contact and meetings to accelerate economic work in Syria and improve trade, investment, and freedom of transportation. In this regard, major steps have been taken in trade," he said. Bolat said investor confidence rises as stability in the region improves, adding that work is underway to open new manufacturing facilities in Syria. He said Turkish and Syrian officials remain in contact about signing a new free trade agreement between the two countries. Bolat recalled that Türkiye and Syria held a Joint Economic and Trade Committee (JETCO) meeting in April, saying major progress had been made in standards, technical harmonization, customs cooperation, joint investments, modernization of customs, increasing trade, participation in mutual fairs, and liberalization of transit trade. He underlined that transit trade to all Gulf countries through Türkiye and Syria had now become possible.

Bolat said transport volumes between the two countries have also increased significantly in line with rising trade. "When the Strait of Hormuz was closed, the Türkiye-Syria-Jordan-Saudi Arabia transit corridor became a lifeline for Middle Eastern and Gulf countries. Now, joint investments between Türkiye and Syria are being discussed. There are preparations for a free zone and a joint industrial zone," he said.

Türkiye, Saudi Arabia advance efforts in railway sector by establishing stronger, more sustainable framework, Turkish transport minister says



Türkiye and Saudi Arabia reached a historic milestone in the transportation and logistics relations by signing memorandum of understanding agreements in transport, railway fields, the Turkish transport and infrastructure minister said. "In this context, we are launching a new phase that will strengthen the exchange of expertise and technical cooperation across a wide range of areas, from logistics centers to modern applications," Abdülkadir

Uraloğlu said.

He said the two countries are also advancing their joint efforts in the railway sector by establishing a stronger and more sustainable framework for cooperation, particularly in the fields of technology, infrastructure, training, and human resources. "May these steps, which will contribute to the connectivity, trade, and development of our region, bring lasting benefits to both our countries," he added. The "Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in the Field of Logistics Services" aims to facilitate the construction of logistics centers, the operation and management of services, the sharing of expertise, and the development of joint activities. The "Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in the Railway Sector," meanwhile, aims to foster joint initiatives across all areas of the railway sector.

Türkiye, EU Underline Railway Freight Cooperation Through Intermodal Transport Project

U-IMT Project aimed at making rail freight more competitive, boosting Middle Corridor capacity, says Turkish transport minister



Türkiye and the European Union underlined cooperation in railway freight and connectivity as the Strengthening Intermodal Transport Services in the Turkish Railway Sector Project came to a close. Transport and Infrastructure Minister Abdülkadir Uraloğlu said that the closing meeting of the U-IMT Project was held with the participation of Marta Kos, the EU commissioner for enlargement.

“With the U-IMT Project, we achieved significant gains that will make our railway freight transport more competitive, increase the capacity of the Middle Corridor, and advance our cooperation with the European Union in the field of connectivity,” Uraloğlu said. He said Türkiye would continue connectivity-focused efforts that enhance the country’s logistics capacity and strengthen trade corridors extending from the Gulf region to Europe. The project, co-financed by the EU and Türkiye, was designed to improve intermodal freight services in the Turkish railway sector and support a shift toward a safer, more environmentally friendly, and balanced transport system. It also aimed to prepare an action plan for intermodal freight services, identify strategic infrastructure needs, and strengthen the institutional capacity of relevant Turkish transport authorities.

The Middle Corridor, also known as the Trans-Caspian International Transport Route, has gained importance as an alternative trade route linking Asia and Europe through Türkiye, the Caucasus, and Central Asia.

Türkiye, Germany Sign Economic Cooperation Protocol, Target \$60B Trade Volume

Ministers discuss investment, Customs Union modernization and visa facilitation at JETCO meeting



Türkiye and Germany signed a new economic cooperation protocol and reaffirmed their goal of increasing bilateral trade to \$60 billion during the sixth meeting of the Türkiye-Germany Joint Economic and Trade Committee, or JETCO, in Ankara. Turkish Trade Minister Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat and German Economy and Energy Minister Katherina Reiche attended the meeting and a roundtable with business representatives from both

countries at the Trade Ministry.

Bolat said the talks focused on trade, investment, industrial cooperation, energy transition, green and digital transformation, transportation, connectivity and cooperation opportunities in third countries. He said the meeting underscored the strength of the economic partnership between the two countries, which he described as being built on deep-rooted ties, mutual trust and shared interests.

Germany is one of Türkiye's most important investment partners and strategic allies, Bolat said, noting that bilateral trade exceeds \$52 billion. Germany is Türkiye's largest export market, third-largest source of imports and one of its leading foreign investors, he added. Turkish companies have invested nearly \$3 billion in Germany, while German companies rank first among foreign investors in Türkiye, operating about 8,600 firms and holding \$26.5 billion in direct investments, according to Bolat.

Bolat said the protocol records progress achieved by both sides and provides a roadmap for future cooperation. The ministers also discussed the modernization of the Türkiye-EU Customs Union. "As the EU shapes new trade, industrial and sustainability policies, including the 'Made in EU' framework, it is vital that these initiatives remain inclusive," Bolat said. "These policies must strengthen the highly integrated supply chains built over decades," he added.

Visa facilitation was also on the agenda, particularly Germany's "cascade" visa system, which Bolat said has helped improve visa appointment and application procedures since July last year. "We once again emphasized our justified demands for visa-free travel for Turkish citizens," he added.

Türkiye, Canada Launch Discussions for Free Trade Agreement

Step reflects ambition of both countries to unlock full potential of commercial partnership, joint statement says



Türkiye and Canada agreed to launch exploratory discussions toward a free trade agreement, according to a joint statement from countries' trade ministries. Turkish and Canadian trade ministers, Prof. Dr. Ömer Bolat and Maninder Sidhu, met to advance the strong and growing economic partnership between the two countries, the statement read.

It noted: "Building on the recent call between Prime Minister Mark Carney and President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan, the ministers reaffirmed their shared commitment to deepening the Canada-Türkiye trade and investment relationship." The statement said the step is reflecting the ambition of both countries to unlock the full potential of the commercial partnership. According to the statement, the ministers welcomed the recent expansion of the Air Transport Agreement, which strengthens connectivity between the two countries and opens new opportunities for travelers, businesses, and exporters. "Enhanced air links will support stronger commercial ties and bring our economies closer together," it noted.

Türkiye's Industrial Output Posts Its Strongest Annual Rise in 8 Months in April

Industrial production index climbs 6% year-on-year, led by 6.8% rise in manufacturing



Türkiye's industrial production rose 6% year-on-year in April, marking the strongest annual increase in eight months, according to official data released. The industrial production index, with a base year of 2021=100, was driven mainly by manufacturing activity, which rose 6.8% compared with the same month last year.

Among the main industrial subsectors, the mining and quarrying index fell 2.8% annually, while the electricity, gas, steam and air conditioning supply index increased 1.8% in April. On a monthly basis, industrial production rose 3.7% in April from March. Manufacturing output increased 4.4% month-on-month, while mining and quarrying rose 0.8%.

Commenting on the data, Türkiye's Treasury and Finance Minister Mehmet Şimşek stated that despite increasing uncertainties in the global economy and challenging external conditions, seasonally adjusted industrial production increased by 6% year-on-year in April. "With our policies that encourage high value-added investment and production, we continue our efforts to transform Türkiye into a global production center," he added.

Türkiye Unveils AI Action Plan at Artificial Intelligence Summit

The plan aims to train 10,000 advanced AI specialists and 100,000 AI application professionals, while launching AI literacy workshops across all 81 provinces.



Türkiye unveiled its "AI Vision and Action Plan for 2026-2030" at the Türkiye Artificial Intelligence Summit in Istanbul. Addressing the summit, President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan outlined a comprehensive national roadmap designed to position Türkiye among the world's leading countries in AI, reaffirming the government's commitment to making the Türkiye Century the century of digital production.

President Erdoğan presented the Action Plan as being structured around four core pillars: Discover, Benefit, Produce, and Govern. Under the Discover pillar, a National AI Literacy Program will provide training to 5 million citizens within two years, with the aim of developing 10,000 advanced AI specialists and 100,000 AI application professionals. A National Data Library will also make at least 2,000 public datasets accessible to researchers, entrepreneurs, and public institutions.

Under the Benefit pillar, AI will be systematically integrated across public services, industry, healthcare, agriculture, and security. Data center capacity will be increased to at least 1 GW by 2030, a minimum

of 2 percent of public investment programs will be allocated to AI projects, and the public sector will serve as the primary customer for domestically developed AI solutions.

Under the Produce pillar, AI growth zones will be established, offering investment-ready campuses and rapid prototyping facilities supported by a National AI Research Fund and an AI Growth Fund. Under the Govern pillar, Istanbul will serve as Türkiye's international AI showcase and investment diplomacy hub, with Terminal İstanbul positioned as a meeting point for entrepreneurs and global investors. Türkiye also committed to playing an active role in shaping human-centered AI standards across OECD, G20, and United Nations platforms.

The Action Plan is expected to generate more than TRY 1 trillion in added value, reinforcing Türkiye's position as the nexus of technology, innovation, and digital production, while underscoring its ambition to emerge as the region's leading hub for AI-driven growth and investment.

More Than 2M Vessels Transit Turkish Straits in 20 Years, Says Transport Minister

Turkish Straits are among world's most critical passages for global trade, energy supply security, says Abdülkadir Uraloğlu



Türkiye plans alternative trade route to Strait of Hormuz via revived Hejaz Railway project, minister says. The Turkish Straits are among the most critical passage points for global trade and energy supply security, with more than 2 million vessels passing through them over the past 20 years, Türkiye's Minister of Transport and Infrastructure Abdülkadir Uraloğlu said.

Speaking at the opening of the fifth Türkiye Maritime Summit in Istanbul, Uraloğlu said maritime transport remains the backbone of global commerce, carrying 88% of world freight, while 85% of Türkiye's foreign trade by tonnage is handled by sea. Uraloğlu said Türkiye's location at the crossroads of continents, civilizations and historic trade routes has made it a central actor in international supply chains and transport corridors. "Türkiye has become an indispensable link in both North-South and East-West corridors," he said, adding that the country's geostrategic position proves that "no corridor can be imagined without Türkiye."

Uraloğlu said recent disruptions around the Strait of Hormuz underscored how vulnerable global transport systems can be and how a single maritime chokepoint can affect world energy supply and supply chains. Uraloğlu said Türkiye aims to develop the Middle Corridor into a high-capacity, competitive trade route linking Asia and Europe. He also highlighted the Development Road Project, which aims to connect the Persian Gulf to Europe through Türkiye, and added that a recently signed memorandum of understanding with Saudi Arabia to revive the new and modern Hejaz Railway would add another major link to this broader logistics network. "With this project, we plan to offer an alternative trade route to the Strait of Hormuz," Uraloğlu said. "Thus, a new option will emerge for cargo from the Gulf region to Europe, and trade flows will be less affected by possible crises."

Reviewing Türkiye's maritime capacity, Uraloğlu said the Turkish-owned merchant fleet reached 2,234 vessels and 51.8 million deadweight tons as of Jan. 1, making it one of the world's largest fleets. He added that five Turkish ports — Ambarlı, Kocaeli, Tekirdag, Mersin and Aliaga — rank among the world's 100 busiest ports. Türkiye also has 85 active shipyards and ranks seventh globally in ship orders and 10th in tonnage. It is second in the world in mega yacht production, third in ship recycling globally and first in Europe, he said. Uraloğlu said Türkiye has signed 65 maritime agreements with 51 countries. An agreement signed with Panama last year increased the number of countries recognizing Turkish seafarers' certificates of competency to 42.

Cruise Lines Make Istanbul Key Homeport As Türkiye's Cruise Traffic Grows

International operators increasingly choose Istanbul as base for Mediterranean routes, boosting passenger volumes and tourism spending



Istanbul is strengthening its position as a key homeport for international cruise tourism, with major cruise companies increasingly choosing the city as both the starting and ending point of their Mediterranean routes. Cruise ship arrivals to Turkish ports rose 2.2% year-on-year to 324, while passenger numbers climbed 3.9% to 455,580. In May alone, arrivals jumped 14.2% to 169 ships, with passenger numbers up 10.8% to 257,897 compared

to the same month last year.

Kusadasi remained the busiest cruise port, but Istanbul followed closely, handling 66 ships in the first five months of the year. A significant share of these vessels used the city not only as a stopover but as a homeport, where passengers begin or end their journeys. Industry data shows that the number of cruise operators using Istanbul as a homeport shot up 50% between 2023 and 2025. Experts say Istanbul's rise as a homeport is driven by its international airport connectivity, modern port infrastructure, efficient border procedures, and strong tourism appeal. Galataport Istanbul, the city's modern cruise terminal, has also improved passenger handling and turnaround operations.

Türkiye Unveils Quantum Roadmap For Defense Industry

Under SSB Quantum Program, Türkiye shares strategic vision for quantum technologies in defense sector



Defense industries chief Haluk Görgün says dependence on critical technologies is not merely procurement issue, but matter of sovereignty. Türkiye has unveiled its roadmap and strategic vision for quantum technologies under the SSB Quantum Program, led by the Turkish Defense Industries Secretariat (SSB).

New-generation capabilities in computing, sensing and communications will directly shape the future of the defense industry, he said, adding that quantum technologies offer strategic advantages in areas ranging from cryptology, optimization, data analysis and simulation to signal-independent navigation systems. Görgün said the defense industry model developed in Türkiye is being closely followed globally, not only because of cost-effective and technology-intensive products, but also due to the performance of Turkish defense companies that have entered global top 100 rankings. Türkiye ranks 11th globally in defense industry exports, he added.

Event to feature defense industry products, demonstration flights by Turkish air platforms



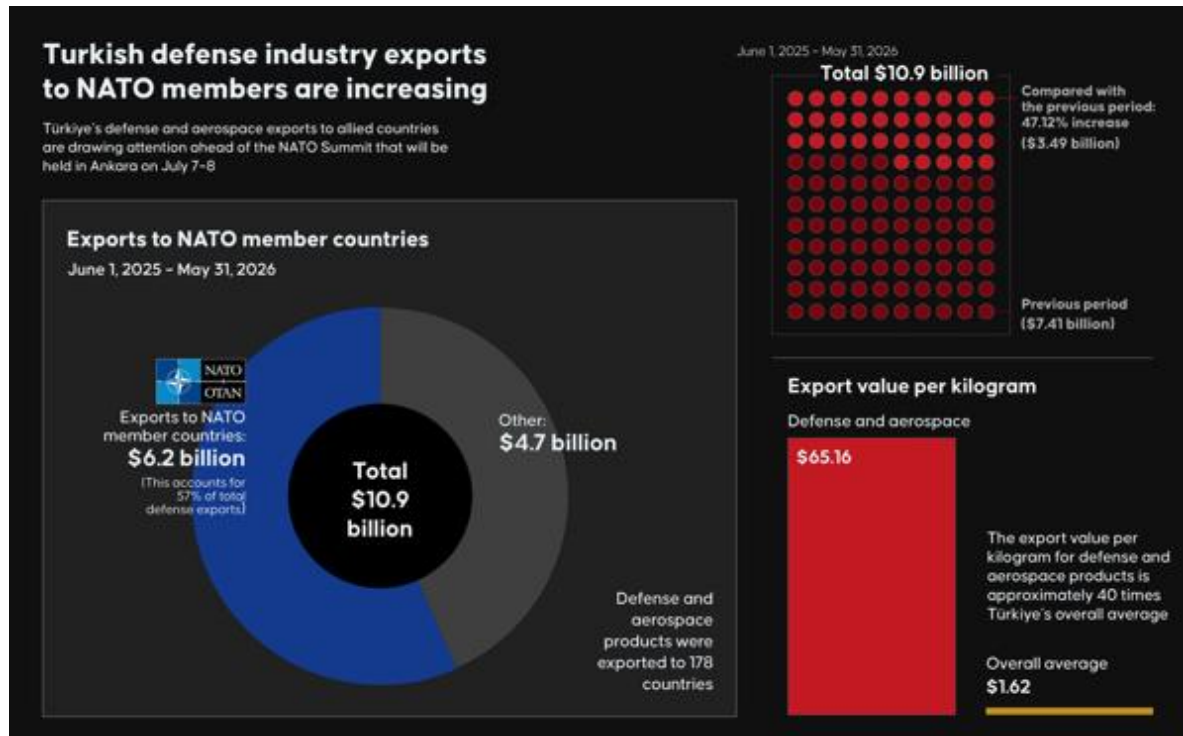

Turkish Defence Exports Approach \$11 Billion As Sales to NATO Allies Increase

Türkiye's defense and aerospace exports to NATO member countries reach \$6.2 billion



Turkish defense and aerospace industry exports to NATO countries have risen sharply over the past year, underlining the sector's growing role in Türkiye's trade with allied nations. Türkiye's defense and aerospace exports jumped 47.1% year-on-year in the 12 months from June 1, 2025 to May 31, 2026, reaching \$10.9 billion, up strongly from \$7.4 billion in the previous 12-month period.

During the period, Turkish defense and aerospace products were exported to 178 countries, with NATO members forming the largest share of the sector's foreign sales. The top three destinations for Turkish defense and aerospace exports were also NATO allies, reflecting Türkiye's expanding defense industry cooperation within the alliance.

Türkiye has strengthened its position not only as a supplier of defense products, but also as a country developing technology, establishing joint production models, and building long-term cooperation with allies. The sector's growth was also reflected in the high value-added nature of its exports.

Türkiye, Poland to Deepen Defense Industry Cooperation

Türkiye, Poland seek stronger cooperation as key NATO allies, says Erdoğan

Turkish President Recep Tayyip Erdoğan said Tuesday Türkiye and Poland are working to strengthen cooperation as two indispensable NATO allies within Europe's security and defense architecture. "Drawing strength from more than six centuries of shared history, we continue to develop cooperation in every field as allies and strategic partners," Erdoğan said at a joint press conference with visiting Polish President Karol

Nawrocki at the Presidential Complex in Ankara. The Turkish president noted bilateral trade had already reached the previous target of 10 billion U.S. dollars, prompting both sides to set a new goal of 15 billion dollars. He added that Turkish contractors are active in Poland with projects worth around 9 billion dollars. Erdoğan highlighted defense industry cooperation as one of the key pillars of bilateral relations, recalling previous joint initiatives involving unmanned aerial vehicles and other defense projects. "As two NATO allies holding an indispensable place in Europe's security and defense architecture, we are working to further strengthen this cooperation," he said.

Nawrocki, in his remarks, described cooperation between the two sides as strategically important and praised the growing partnership in defense and security affairs. "Poland and Türkiye play a very important role within NATO. Both countries are responsible for defending the alliance's flanks, making our cooperation strategically significant," Nawrocki said. He added Polish armed forces are operating Bayraktar unmanned aerial vehicles purchased from Türkiye, calling the acquisition a symbol of the close defense ties between the two allies.

Turkish, Spanish Defense Industries Sign Strategic Cooperation Deals

Agreements aim to link defense SMEs, prime contractors and supply chains in Türkiye and Spain



Turkish and Spanish defence industry representatives signed strategic cooperation agreements. The agreements are expected to form the basis of future defence and aerospace events in Ankara and Valencia.
